

195 Lindi, rep. a. 1724(?) in a field behind the house, where the Lord Hussey was beheaded for rebellion under Henry VIII, opposite John of Gaunts house HORSL. Litteris magnis, quarum has distinxit STUK.

191 Lindi, upon the steeple of St. Mary's church they have placed in the wall an antient monumental stone with this imperfect inscription STUK. St. Mary-le-Wigford, in the Norman tower, on the right hand side of the western doorway TROLL. Ibidem extat, litterae sunt bonaes saeculi puto primi. Supra insculptus est titulus christianus saeculi XVI.




