200 In the latter end of the month of April a. d. 1597 a. Elizabethae reg. 39, one Thomas Miles, a labouring man, and John Hallywell, digging upon a lave of stones at the back of the house of Jeffery Ramsden, at the thick Hollins, did light upon a stone, squared, in length about a yard, having Roman characters on two sides engraven cet. There was also found in the said laves and in other places thereabouts, divers foundations of houses, and some Roman coins, and squared stones and thick stones with iron nails. The ground called thick Hollins is lying upon the height near the Clay-house, near unto Linwell HANSON. Ad Gretland in cacumine montis . . . effossa: nunc cernitur Bradleiae in aedibus Ioannis Savili Baronis Scaccarij CAMD. I saw it lying lose in the church at Conington HORSL. Per Ioh. Cottonem a. 1750 Cantabrigiam pervenit ibique servatur in Trinity college. Est ara parva litteris non profundis.
