Inter stationes quovis genere antiquitatum Romanarum fecundissimas inde ab saeculo XVI exeunte iure ea numeratur, quae a *Maryport* oppido maritimo hodie satis celebri versus septentriones sita est in loco eminenti et natura ipsa munito, proprio illo inde a Camdeni tempore gentis *Senhouse* (cf. Goughs Camden 3 p. 423. 439), quae a. 1766 aream castelli effossionibus institutis detegendam curavit (cf. Hutchinson *Cumberl.* 2

p. 280 ss.). Quae hodie ibi supersunt vestigia *Bruce* ita descripsit (*wall* p. 365): *the ramparts of the station are strongly developed, and most of its gateways may be distinguished. The sill of the eastern gateway is grooved by the action of chariot wheels; within the station is a well encased with circular masonry. Situs castrorum ad ripam Ellen rivi a Camdeno et Horsleio Ellenborough nominatur, ab Hodgsonne Alneborough;*
