## XL. HEXHAM.

A Corstopito versus occidentem, a vallo autem tam procul distans quam illud, situm est Hexham oppidum hodie non infrequens. Ibi castrorum vestigia tam certa quidem, quam alibi solent esse, detecta non sunt (cf. Goughs Camden 3 p. 493. 508), quanquam non desunt omnino (v. Bruce *wall* p. 343), tamen tituli ibi inventi clare monstrant, ut iam perspexerat Horsleius (p. 250), milites Romanos, cohortem ut videtur et vexillationes legionarias ibi collocatos fuisse (cf. n. 482. 484). Quod Horsleius Epeiacum Ptolemaei ibi quaeri posse dicit, id coniecit tantum

Ptolemaeum in loco designando insigniter errasse ratus (verba eius sunt: *the situation of this does by no means answer*); cf. quae de eo dixi supra in praefatione cap. XXXVIII.
