Hodgson adnotat: The late Mr. Isaak Jopling,  
of Gateshead, sculptor, told me that Mr. Swin-  
burne, the author of travels in Spain and the two  
Sicilies, employed him to make an altar to be set  
up in some part of his grounds at Hamsterly,  
near Ebchester, and that after it was inscribed  
(sequitur titulus s. s.), it was scoured with a sand-  
stone to take off its appearance of newness. But  
was it this altar or some other, which Mr. Jop-  
ling was employed to make? Mr. Swinburne wrote  
in the Gentlemans Magazine under the signature of  
Porcustus, in which great store house of history  
he gives an account of this altar (l. s. s.). Ita-  
que ipse Hodgson suspicionem incertam esse  
concedit; equidem magis putaverim titulum male  
lectum esse, et imperite restitutum a quadratario  
illo recenti quam fictum omnino.

citer quinti, ut proposit Bruce.
