

715 Rep. prope vallum some time ago at the Bower, South Tine, iuxta Busie Gap HUNT. This stone was some years ago removed from Littlechesters to Beltingham, where the masons wrought it ut for a gravestone, and utterly destroyed the inscription. Lapis erat about two yards long, and about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a yard broad HORSL.
