

**775** In 1828 recently taken out of a house at Greenhead, but it was known to have been brought from the Roman wall, a little to the east of Thirlwall castle HODGS. Nunc in Holmhead prope Thirlwall castle, built, upside down, into an outhouse BRUCE.
