



866 At Burdoswald, lying upon a wall a little westward from the station, the letters are well cut, and are deep in the stone SWINH. Periit BRUCE.


867 At Burdoswald rep. a. 1802; a. 1813 in the possession of the bishop of Chester in the garden of his prebendal house at Carlisle, litteris evanidis LYS. Ibi frustra indagavit BRUCE.


868 At Underhaugh, a house at the foot of the hill between Burdoswald and the river Irthing, in the jamb of the door of the dwelling house HORSL.

870a Willoford. There is also a large stone built up in the court wall, upon which there may possibly be an inscription; but the side on which it must be, if at all, is entirely covered.

870b Burdoswald. There is another altar built up in the Milk-house, of which the inscription is quite worn out.

870c I found at Underhaugh . . . a broken altar with a mutilated inscription, made use of to set the bars of the fire place upon, and for what is called in that country a *hud-stone*.

871 On a rock, over the river Irthing, near Naworth Castle, between Lanercost and Burdoswald LYS. On the Coome Crags MAUGH. About 2 miles to the west of Birdoswald, $\frac{1}{4}$ mile beyond Wallbours mile-castle . . . is Coome Crag, a bold red-sandstone cliff, projecting into the channel of the river Irthing . . . ; a quarry from which the Romans probably obtained extensive supplies of stone, and on the face of which they have left a record of their labours . . . ; the Roman inscriptions . . . are on the eastern side of the projecting rock, most of them on the upper ledge, one nearer its base BRUCE. Litterae eodem modo insculptae sunt atque in titulo simili n. 733.
