In the garden of the adjoining mansion of House-steeds or Castle-steeds BRAND (1783). Rep. in the bank of a rivulet, which runs by the fort CARL. Carlisle, apud Miss Carlyle HODGS. Nunc at Lazonby Hall BRUCE; est ara alta ped. 4 dig. 2, lata ped. 1 dig. 7, caput cum v. 1 vi aquae decidit.






