



VI f. 303 qui addit: 'Scalby castrum olim Tilliorum, qui olim clari in hoc tractu fuerunt; Scalby castle is hard by & therfore I think that this was some monument of thes Tillioli'; inde sine dubio Grut. 1178, 14 'a Cottono' una cum n. 979, unde loci indicatio prava orta est, ita LE . . . TILIO.
