989. 990 At the Park-head, about half a mile from Risingham, lies the upper part of an imperfect altar; the letters are rude and unevenly cut, and possibly the inscription never was finished, if one may conjecture from the vacant space below the second line HORSL. In Newcastle in museo, part of an altar BRUCE. Fragmentum Aelianense idem esse atque Horsleianum probabile est, non certum.
