XII. WEST (sive OLD) KILPATRICK, STATIO PER LINEAM VALLI DECIMA?

Ultima, cuius vestigia olim observata sunt, quanquam non admodum certa, statio sita erat in colle dicto *the Chapel hill* prope *West* sive *Old Kilpatrick* vicum (Horsley p. 164; Roy p. 157; Stuart p. 287 ss.); cum accedant tituli tres vallares (n. 1140—1142) ibi aut in vicinia reperti (nam probabiliter id statuitur a Stuarto, quamvis non ubique adsint testimonia certa), stationem ibi fuisse nobis persuaserunt antiquarii Scoti. Ea igitur fortasse *Ravennatis Credigone* erat atque Ptolemaei *Rerigonium*. Neque vero certum est, quanquam ita video statui a doctis Britannis omnibus, vallum re vera ibi terminari neque ultra *Westkilpatrick* extendi. Timothéus Pont sane et doctor Irvine (cf. Stuart p. 286) vestigia Romana sibi visi sunt observasse prope *Gle-*

narbach (ubi viae trames dicitur superesse) *Dunglass* (cf. Horsley p. 164) *Dumbuckhill* et ad *Dumbarton* oppidum, prope quod Bedae *Alcluith* existimatur fuisse, oraeque maritimae natura ibi talis est, ut facile omnia ibi valli vestigia tam facile potuerint perire, quam perierunt valli Hadriani partes versus occidentem extremam in similis orae planitie; ut supra vidimus Itaque de valli termino occidentali non magis constat quam de orientali. Sibbald is very much mistaken in saying that this stone was found at Ardoch, in Strathallan; for it certainly was dug out of Grahams dike, and lay a long time at the duke of Montrose's house at Mugdock, from whence it was carried to the college of Glasgow* GORD.
