Quamquam in miliaribus Britannicis nunquam repertum est nomen legati cum imperatoris coniunctum, quod in aliis provinciis non rarum est, tamen cum de forma lapidis constet, dativus *Felici* fortasse male lectus non obstat, quo minus nomina imperatoris sexto casu exhibita esse putemus. Eodem casu etiam legati nomina possunt posita esse. Sin nomina legati primo casu posita esse existimamus, cogitandum est de basi honoraria. Legatus idem fortasse redit in titulo n. 351, qui est anni eiusdem.

Brand *Newcastle* 1 p. 605 qui addit (adn. l): a lettered stone, broken into two or three pieces, had been turned out of the earth a little before; . . . I endeavoured without success to recover these perhaps valuable fragments.
