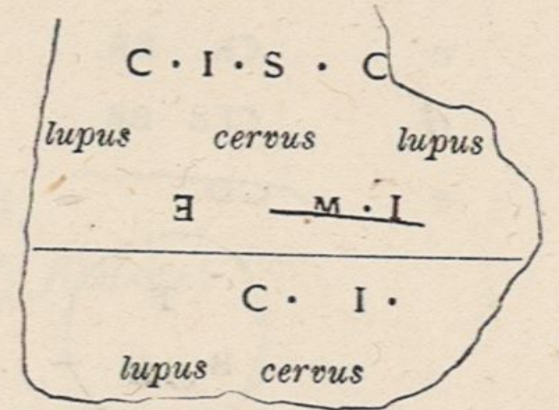

Descripsi.

1244 *Ashtead Church (in Ashtead Park, St. Giles), Copthorne Hundred, Surrey. Ecclesiae eius fenestra parva tegulis Romanis clausa est; aliae eiusdem generis tegulae (flue tiles) repertae sunt, dum ecclesia restauratur, they are, mostly, ornamented by rectangular markings. But on one piece is a slightly-raised delineation of a wolf attacking a stag; a subject forming part of a running design covering the entire face of the tile. Tegulae illae tum servabantur apud the Rev. Mr. Legge, at the Rectory, Ashtead Church.*
